#### The Goal...

# "Teach every Second Grade Student in Guilford County Public Schools to Swim"

#### The Alarming Statistics...

- Eight children drown each week in the United States
- For every child who dies from drowning, another 5 receive emergency department care for nonfatal submersion injuries
- 61% of *ALL* children do not know how to swim
- 68% of African American children do not know how to swim
- 56% of Hispanic children do not know how to swim
- 48% of Caucasian children do not know how to swim
- Drowning ranks 5<sup>th</sup> among the leading causes of unintentional injury death in the U.S.

#### The Successes...

- **2012:** Learn to Swim program begins with *four* elementary schools, with <u>257</u> graduating from the program
- 2016: The program grows to  $\underline{9}$  schools with  $\underline{678}$  graduates
- **2017-2018 School Year:** The program expands to include seven locations in High Point and 24 total locations in Guilford County, with an estimated <u>1,455</u> expected to graduate
- **2018-2019 School Year:** The program expands again to include 32 total locations with an estimated 2,045 expected graduates
- **2023-2024 School Year:** The program has 46 locations with an estimated 3,000 expected graduates

# The Challenge...

## Only 68% of Guilford County 2nd Graders can participate due to lack of funding!

- There are <u>67</u> elementary schools in Guilford County this year, 5,636 second-grade students are enrolled in these schools
- Learn to Swim is 100% funded by Private Funds
- Average Cost: \$45 per student for five lessons; \$3,500 per school
- Average Annual Cost for ALL 2<sup>nd</sup> Graders: \$235,000
